Caring for a bird is a serious **responsibility.** It is very important that each person desiring to adopt a rescue bird, be able to provide adequate housing, good nutrition, exercise, and stimulation for the bird. Anyone wishing to adopt a bird must be able to morally and financially be able to take on this responsibility. It is important that you educate yourself on the species you wish to adopt and ask any questions on aspects of care you are uncertain about. Adopters must be 18 years of age to adopt a bird. Please answer all the questions and e-mail this application back to: betta5@yahoo.com with the subject Bird Application in the subject line. After the application is processed you will be contacted and a home visit may be scheduled. All questions must be answered for this application to be processed. **All questions** must be answered to proceed.

Adoption Fee Note:

Rescue birds are often kept and cared for, for several months minimum. This means each bird requires a large cage, quality food, toys, and hours of time to tame them or modify behavioral issues. In addition to the costs just mentioned, ill or injured birds may require veterinary care which will also increase costs for the rescue. These birds will not be given away for free. Generally adoption fees will be \$100 for a cockatiel/with cage / supplies and \$150 for a pair of cockatiels with cage/toys/food. Adoption fees are a way of insuring that you will be able to financially care for the bird(s) you want to adopt (as well as help get back a portion of money spent on them so that other rescue birds can be helped and cared for). Please realize that often more money has been spent on individual birds than the adoption fee requested. All adoption fees collected are used to care for other rescue birds.
