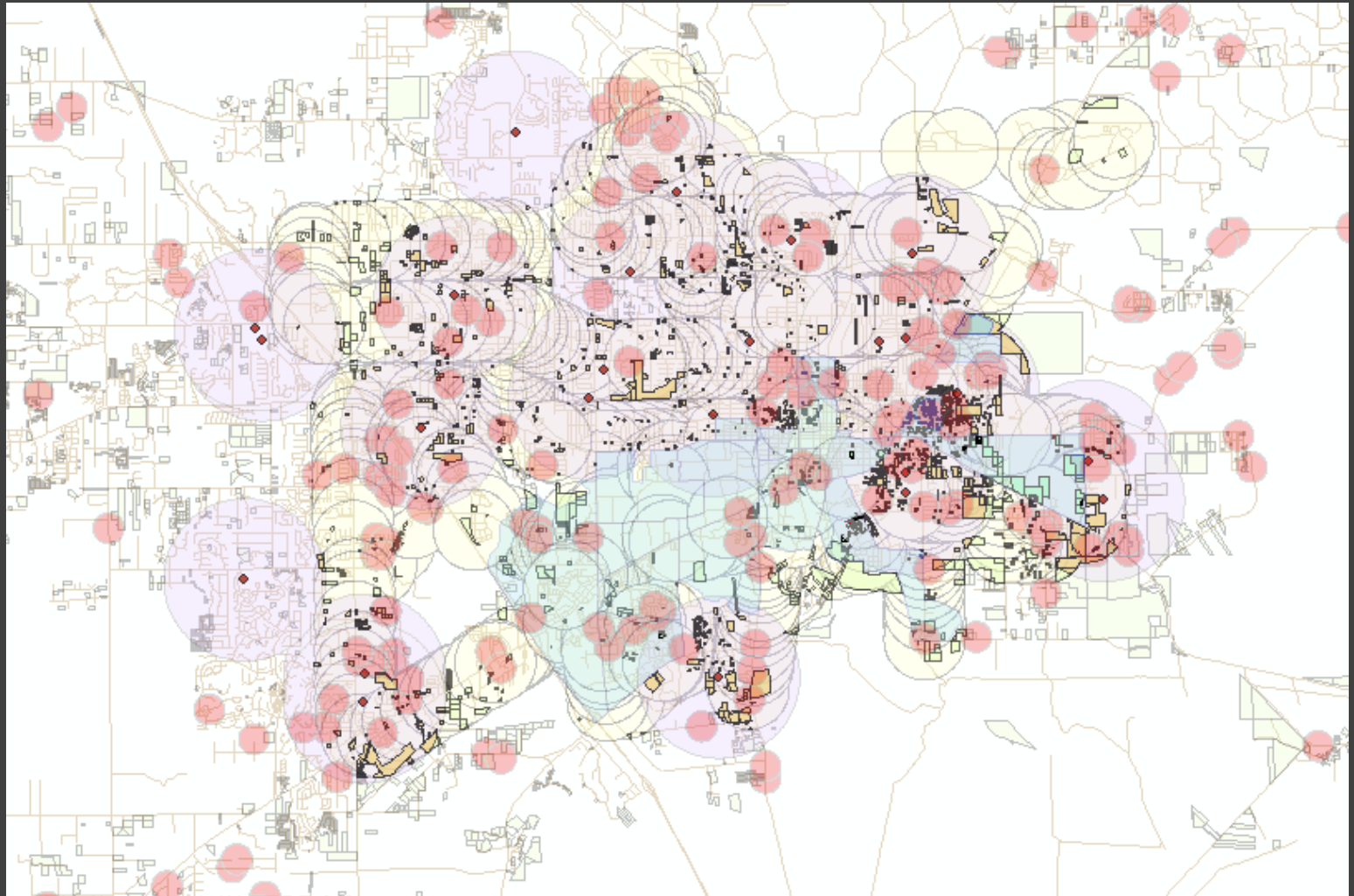

Project Background

- Provide locations for three Women and Children Community Centers
- Mission: **shelter and enable** victims of domestic violence and provide additional public services to the general community
- **Primary Services**
 - **Provide housing** for 30 days for pregnant and parenting teens, homeless families, and children who are victims of abuse and neglect
 - **Therapy** to help visitors cope with their trauma
 - Provide **education for essential job skills**
 - Provide **prevention education**
- **Additional Services**
 - **Libraries**
 - **Tutoring services**
 - **Health centers**
 - **Sports complexes**



Scope and Characteristics of Study

- **Alachua County**

- **Over 255,000 residents**
- **Over 50,000 live below the poverty line, at least 8,000 of which are children**
- **Approximately 1,200 residents are homeless, including over 400 children**

- **Gainesville's favorable conditions**

- **Highest population in Alachua county**
- **Extensive public bus system**
- **Regions of the lowest income in Alachua County**
- **Majority of the schools in Alachua County**



- **Gainesville's negative aspects**

- **Child neglect and abuse cases are scattered across the county, but a high concentration exists west of Gainesville**
- **Domestic violence also has the highest concentration west of Gainesville**
- **Gainesville is also home to the majority of sex offenders in the county**



- The three community centers will target:
- **Women and children (ages 0-19)**
- **Easily accessible by public transportation**
- **Close to high children density and schools**
- **Areas with low socioeconomic status**
- **Located safely away from sex offenders**

Criteria

1. Parcel Use Categories labeled vacant institutional or vacant residential parcels
2. Parcels within ½ mile of RTS bus stops
3. Parcels completely within 1 mile of schools
4. Parcels within census blocks of median income less than \$22,000 (poverty line)
5. Parcels at least 1,000 feet away from sex offenders
6. Parcels will be at least 1 to 2 acres in size
7. Parcels will be at least 2.5 miles from one another

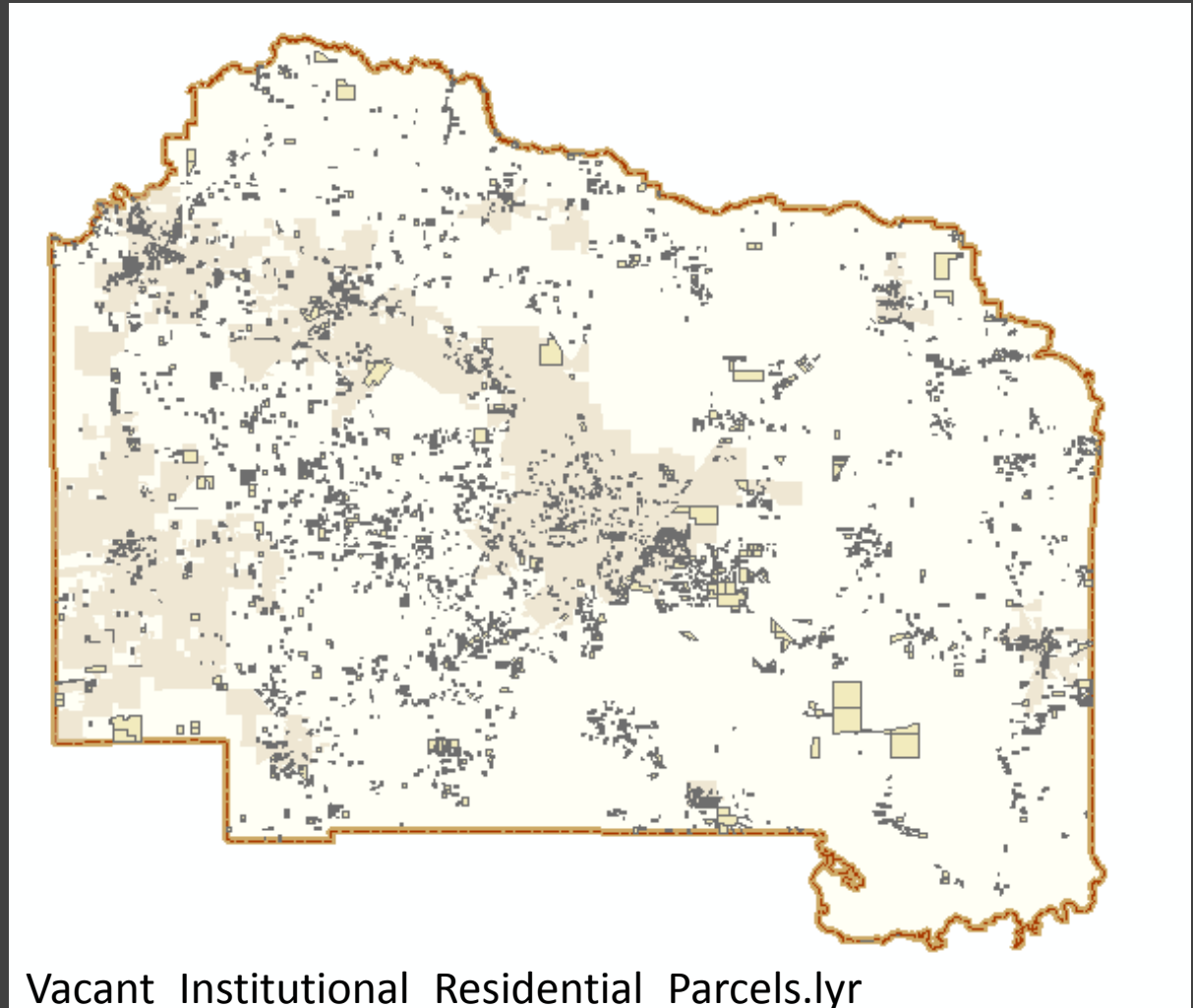
- Community Planning: Tax Parcels

'Vacant Residential'

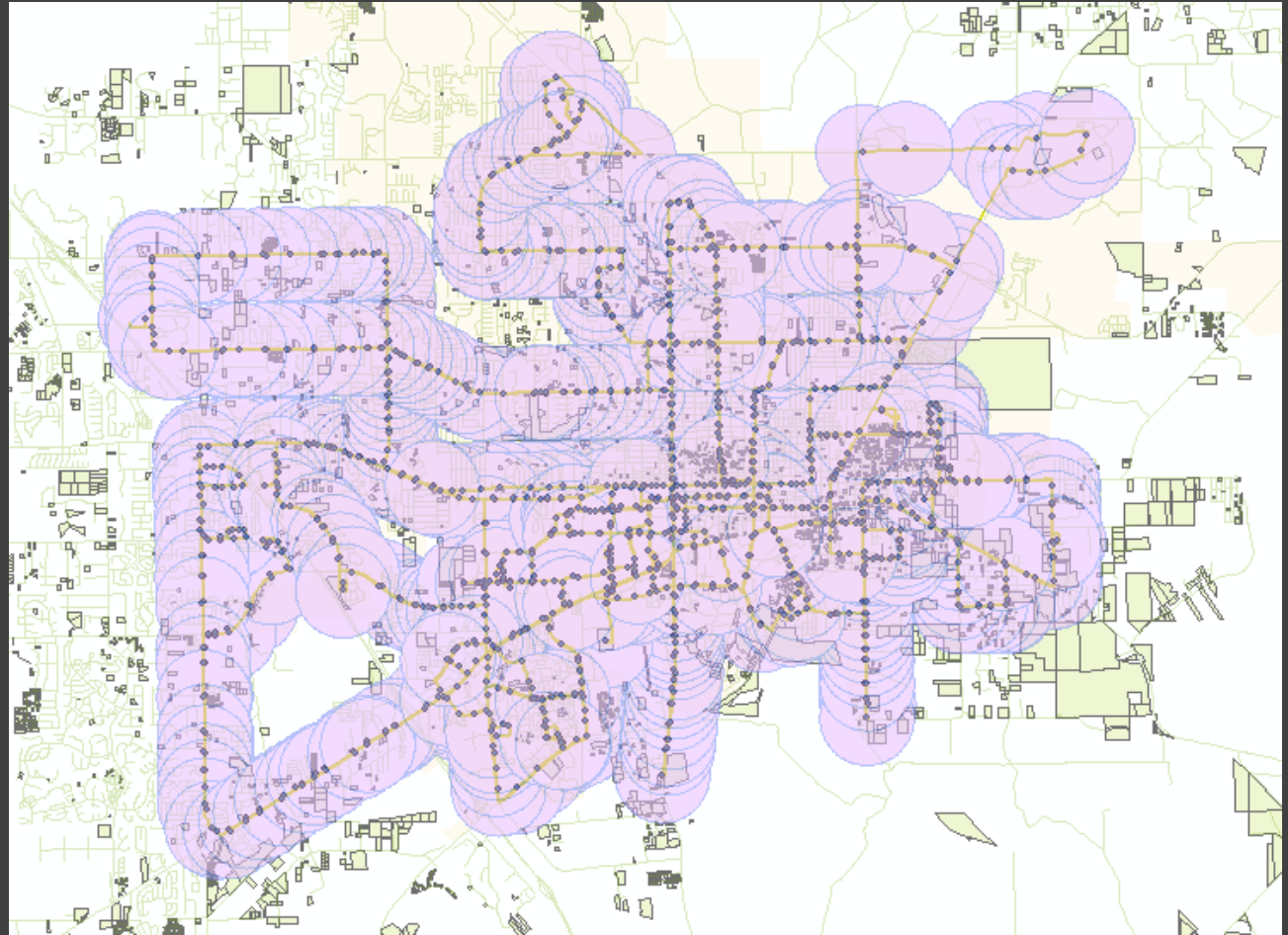

around Bus Stops



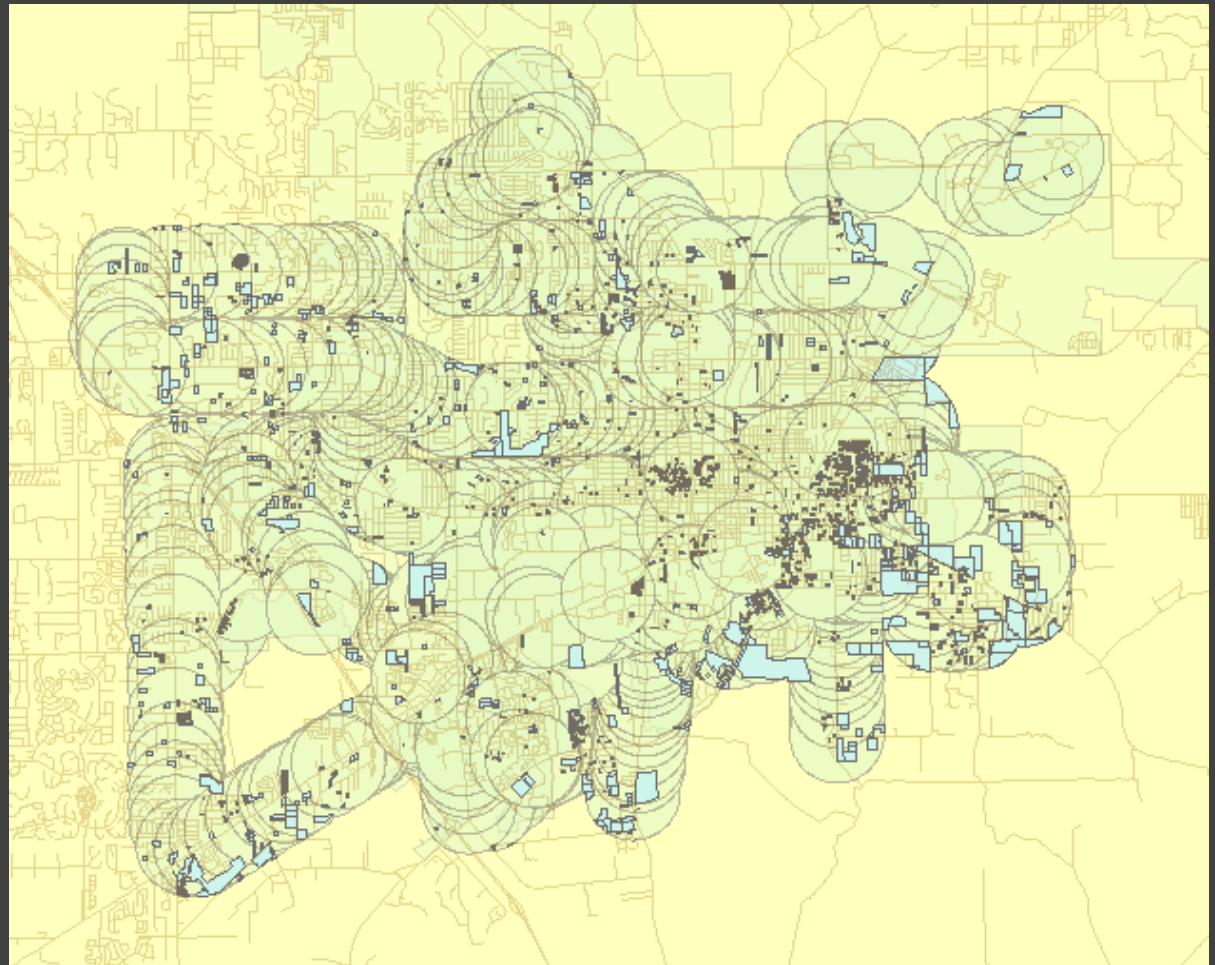

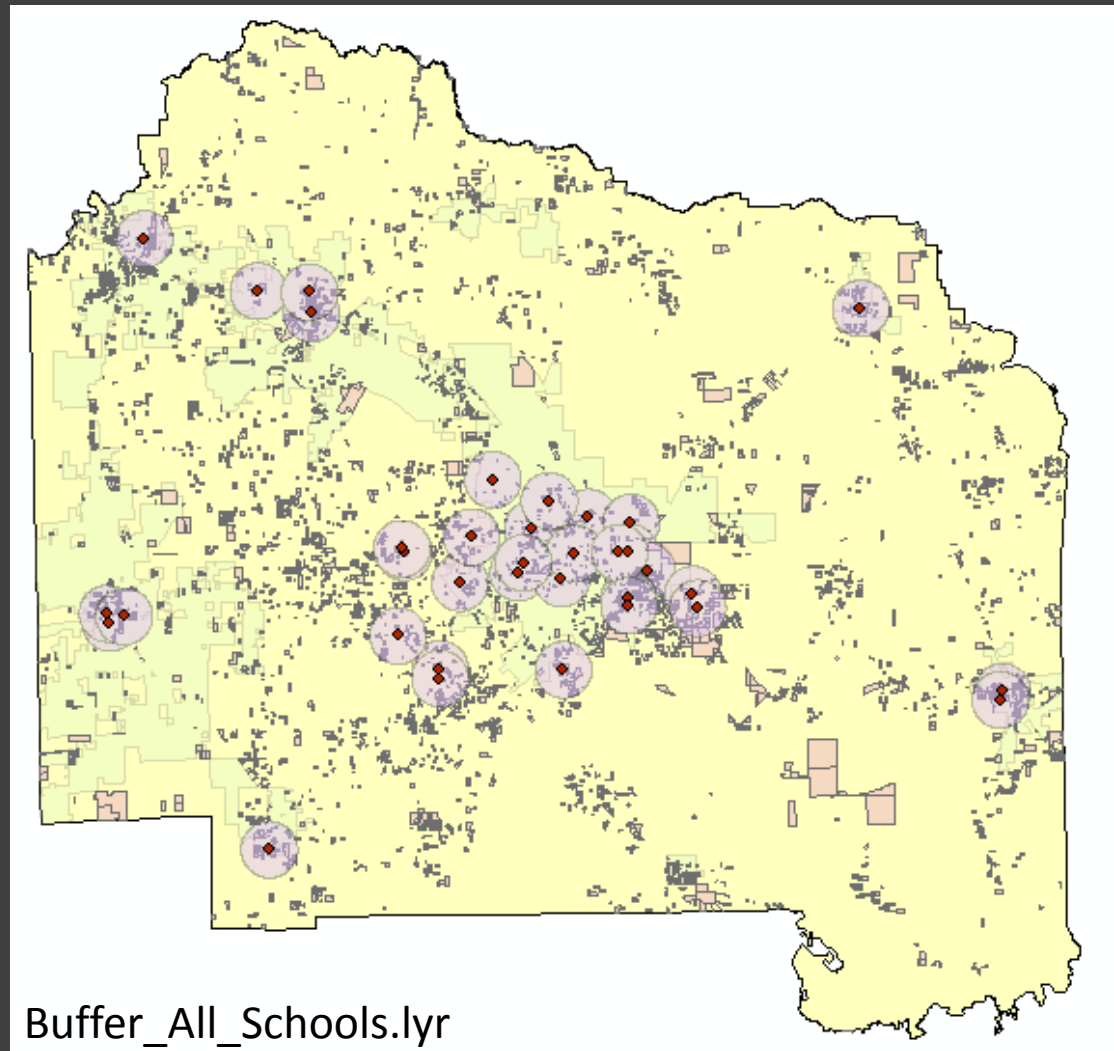

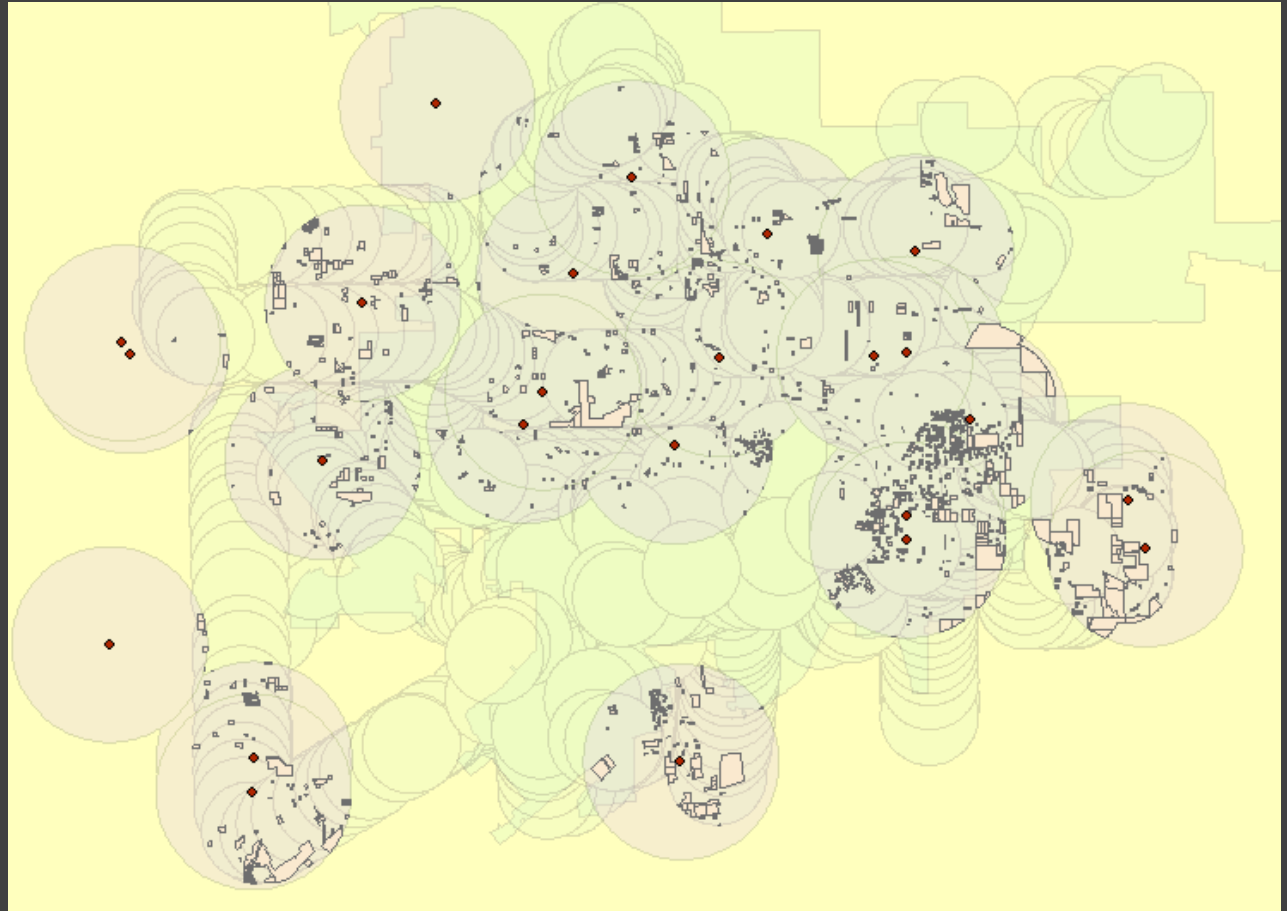

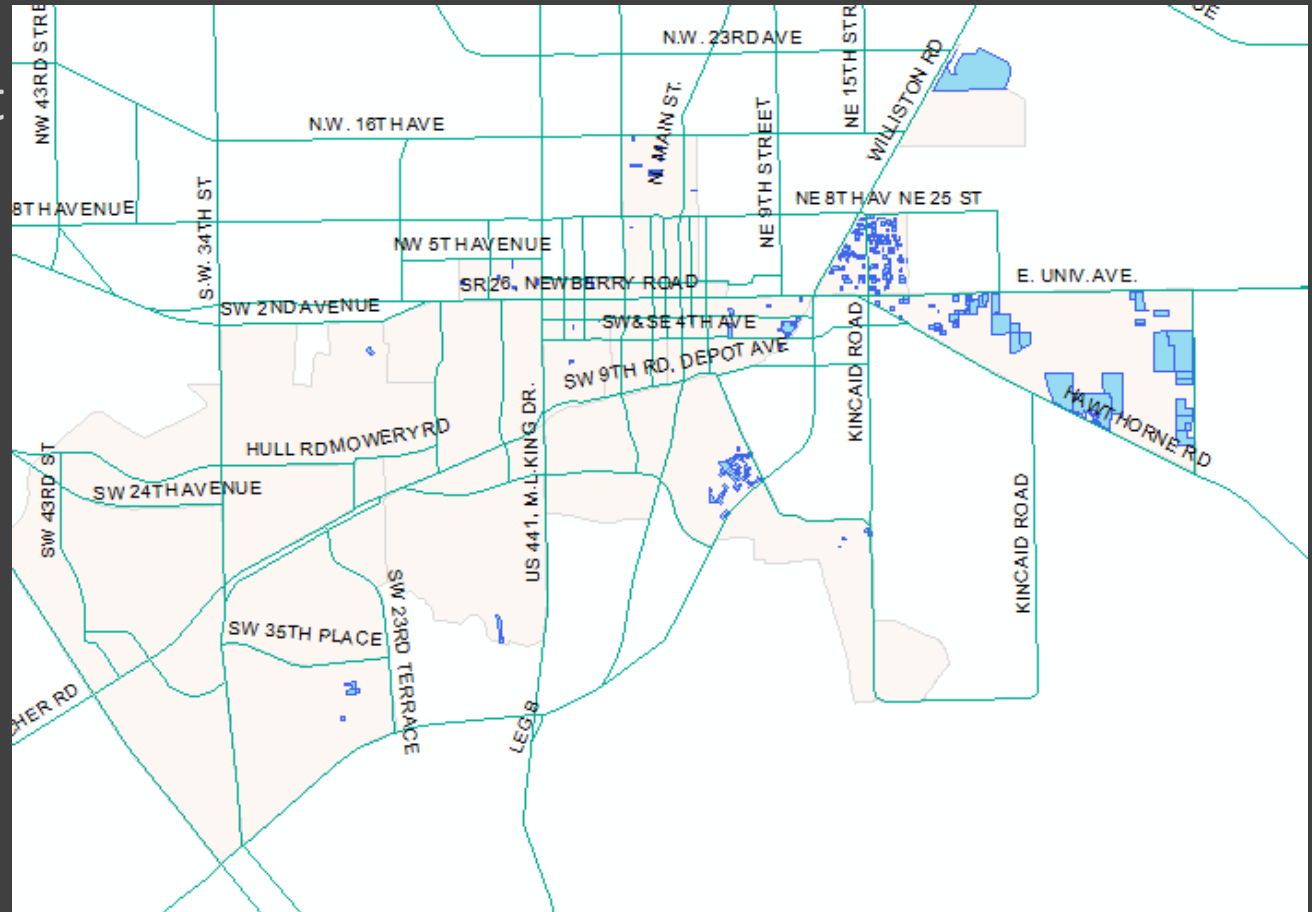

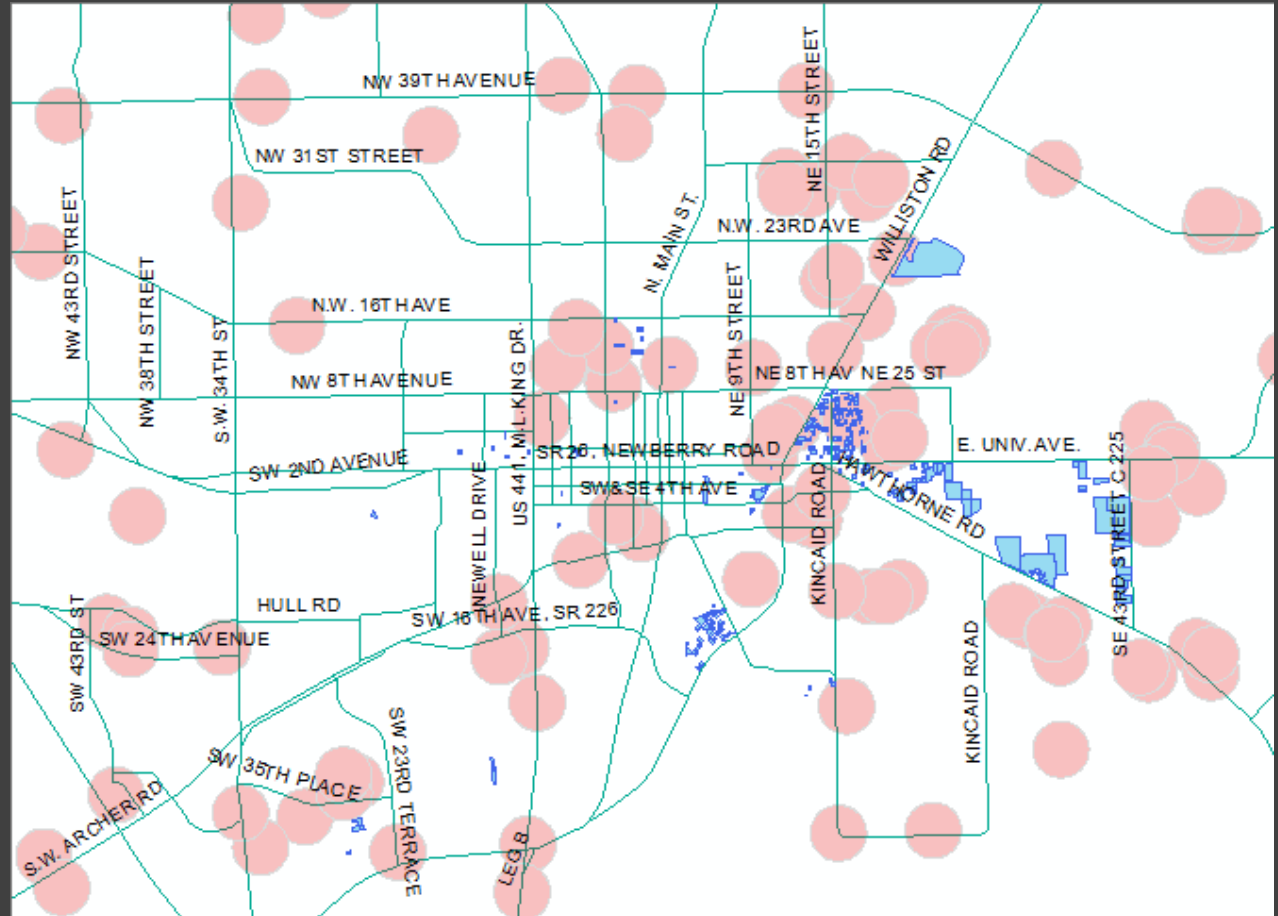

- 1000ft buffer of sex offenders

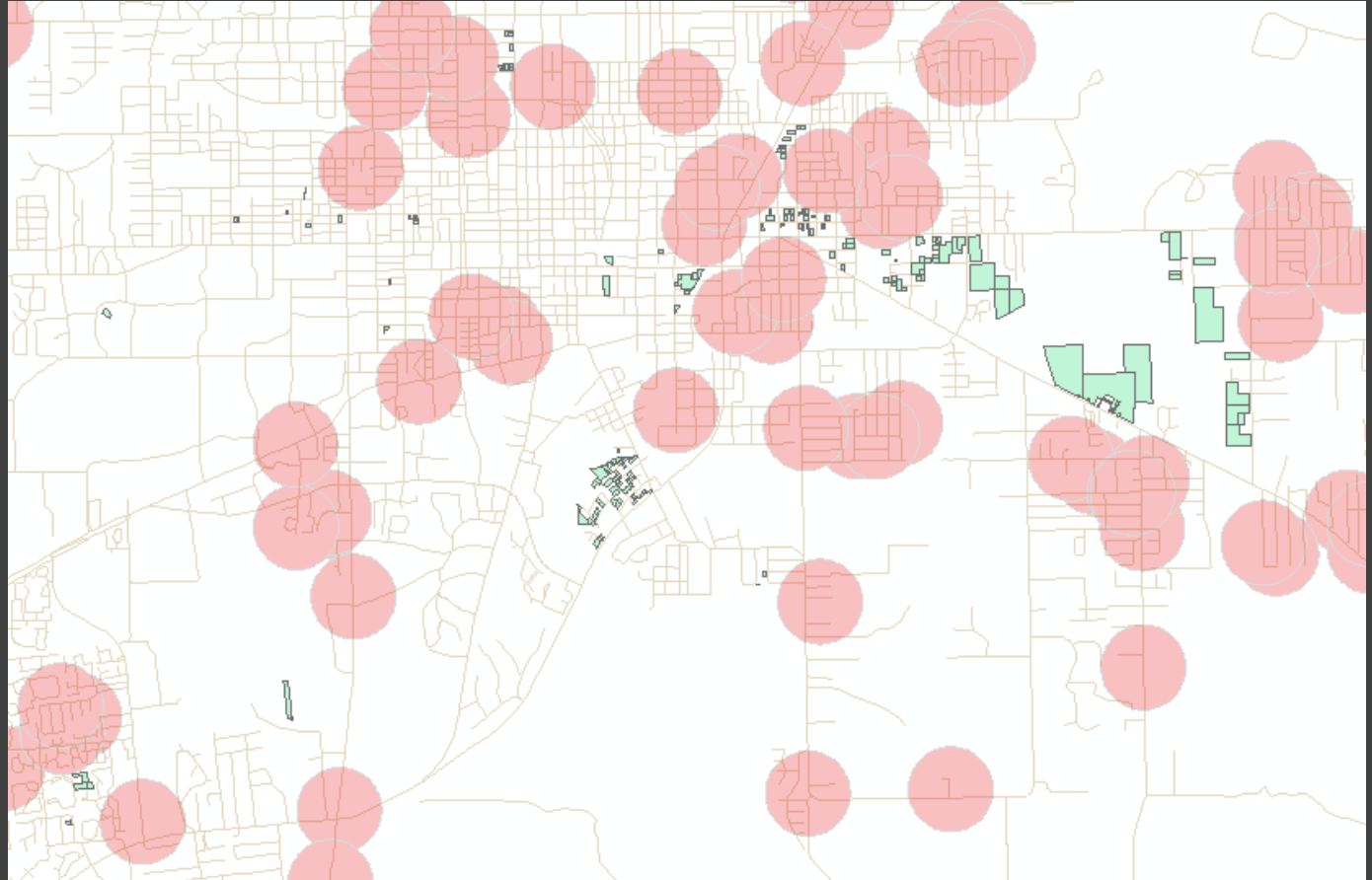
Selection: parcels that intersect 1000ft buffer

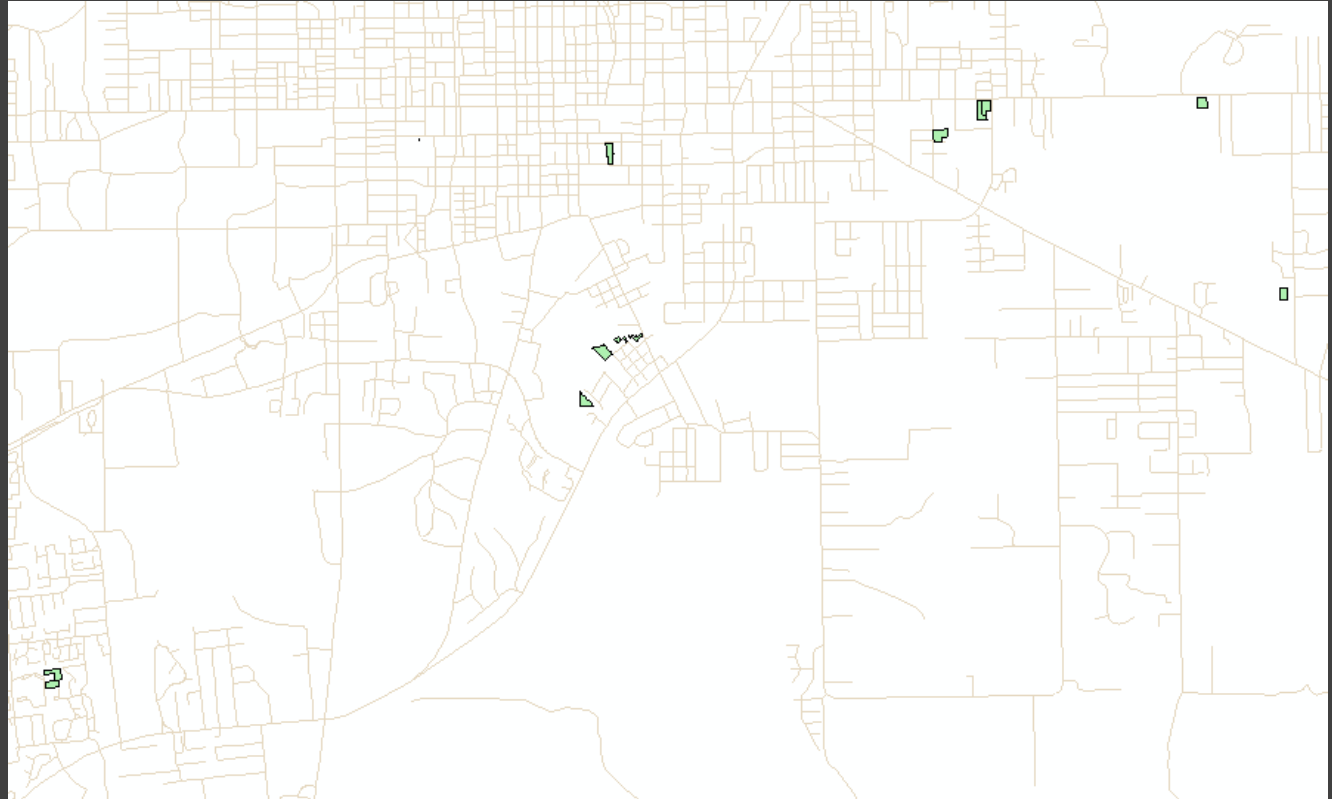

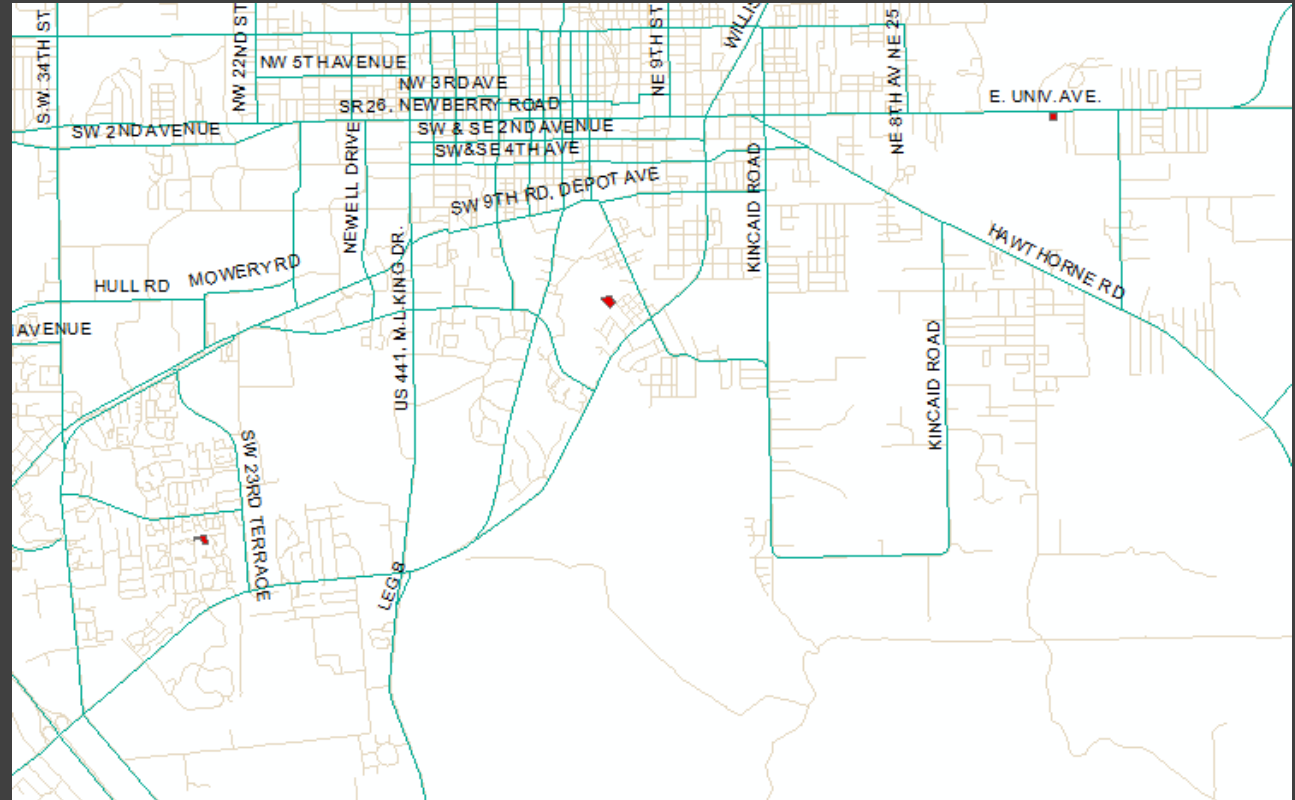

Conclusion

- All centers will be located in impoverished areas.
- All centers will be located within 1 mile of a school and within 1/2 mile of the bus stop network to allow easier access.
- To help protect children, the locations are spaced at least 1000 feet from any sex offenders.
- The centers are at least 2.5 miles from one another so that residents in many locations may benefit.
- The Downtown Center is located next to St. Francis House (around 0.9 miles).
- The community centers will provide essential services for Alachua County's poorest citizens in need.
